

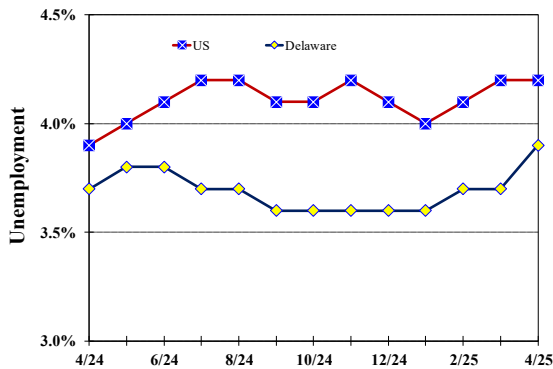

Monthly Commentary

Year-to-date, seasonally adjusted over-the-month job growth has averaged 850 new jobs, slightly above the 600 jobs gained during the same period in 2024. In April, the Private Education and Health Services industry grew by 3,300 jobs over-the-year, representing three-quarters of the total over-the-year jobs increase. Growth was led by new jobs in Hospitals and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities, which increased by 1,300 and 600, respectively. Food Service and Drinking Places, a subsector of the Leisure and Hospitality Industry, saw the greatest decline in its number of jobs compared to a year ago, falling by 1,500. Federal Government jobs remain at 6,700, the same level as in April 2024.

Delaware Labor Force Trends

Delaware's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in April 2025 was 3.9%, up from 3.7% in March 2025. There were 19,600 unemployed Delawareans in April 2025 compared to 18,900 in April 2024. The US unemployment rate was 4.2% in April 2025, unchanged from March 2025. In April 2024, the US unemployment rate was 3.9%, while Delaware's rate was 3.7%.

In April 2025, seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment was 494,200, up from 493,000 in March 2025. Since April 2024, Delaware's total nonfarm jobs have increased by a net gain of 4,400, a rise of 0.9%. Nationally, jobs during that period increased by 1.2%.

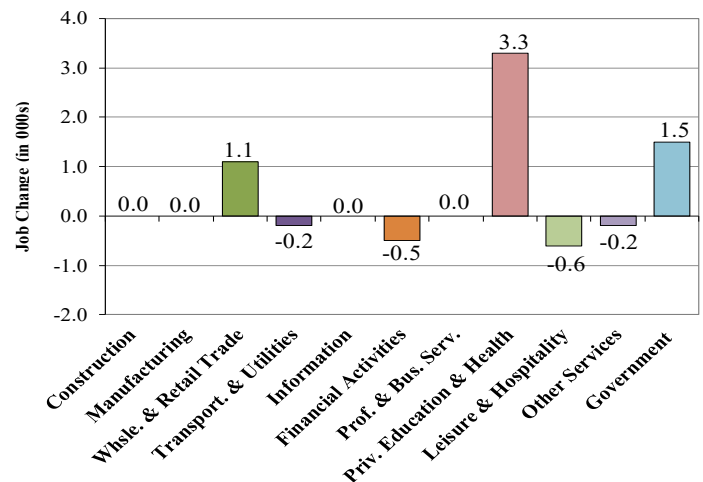
